Civil Aviation Airfield

- Airfield size 59.3 hectares, approx. 74% of which is green planted
- 1 paved runway; length: 1,292 meters, width: 32 meters (surface: grooved asphalt)
- 1 grass runway; length: 652 m, width: 20 m
- MAIN APRON: 2 airplane parking places (for aircraft of more than 5 metric tons)
- GRASS APRON: 12 airplane parking places (for aircraft of less than 5 metric tons in the southern section and for aircraft of less than 2 metric tons in the northern section of the airport)

- 2 gates, each with a waiting area

History

- 1926 - Official founding of the Bolzano Airport
- 1992 - Founding of ABD AIRPORT AG
- 1992 - Beginning of expansion work into a modern airport structure
- 1999 - Completion of expansion work and inauguration of the new airport structure
- 2006 - Completion of the certification process by the Italian air traffic authorities ENAC and granting of the airport certification
- Mar. 2011 - Alto Adige provincial government approves the master plan for the development of the Bolzano Airport
- Oct. 2015 - Approval of a strategic development concept for the Bolzano Airport (ACV study) by the Alto Adige provincial assembly
- Dec. 2015 - Resurfacing of the paved runway
- Jun. 2016 - In a public opinion poll, the population of Alto Adige comes out against the public financing of the Bolzano Airport
